Going out more! A lot more. And meeting new people, and very importantly, I have got to know so many different people from all different backgrounds and I love them all! I like them all and get on with every person. They have taught me a lot about life.

4. What caused this change?

I think it was just throwing off my worry about getting involved in things. I am involved with the WI as well but here I get to meet so many people outside of who I would usually run into. I have met so many male, female others that taught me life is not just ordinary

5. If you were to tell other people about People Speak Up, what would you say?

People have asked me about PSU and I can't explain it in less than 200 pages. It is eclectic and I guess I end up saying, i will bring you a leaflet because there is so much to do here and I find it covers all ages, a range of people and I just can't explain it in a simple phrase.
